Petro is Assistant Professor of Religion at Boston Professor and he will be the kickoff speaker for activities for World AIDS Day on December 1st. He will talk to us about how religion and politics joined forces to ensure that a disease went unchecked for nearly a decade in the 1980's until a group of activists joined forces to overcome prejudice and stigma with compassion. Advent Book Discussion: Wed Nov 30th, 7pm in the Chapel: We are headed into the darkest time of the year and Advent season, preparing ourselves for Christmas, when light plays a large physical and spiritual role. It's the perfect time of the year to read a book about darkness...but what does darkness mean to us with all the artificial light in our age? Purchase *The End of Night* by creative nonfiction writer Paul Bogard from the book sale shelf near the Chapel, or order a copy from the library system. Prepare to read your favorite passage and explain why it is, joining in the discussion on the first Wednesday in Advent. Led by Revs. Jim and Heike, sponsored by the Environmental Ministries Team.

This is an intergenerational choir, and open to the young and the younger, 4 to 94. You can sit with your families in church, and come up to sing the two times during the service.

The Once in a While Choir is, as you might imagine, a group of people who love to sing, but are unable to participate every week. Even if you can't read music, come! If you can only make it to one of the two rehearsals, come! If you want to have an uplifting and fun musical experience, we'll see you at rehearsals!

The Outreach Committee advocates to the church and it's members about important issues relating to social justice in our church, community, city state and the world.
