Faith Weekend of Action

This weekend, April 9-10, all over the Commonwealth, congregations of many faiths are lifting up the issue of transgender rights. The campaign called "Faith Weekend of Action" is to bring awareness to the bill in the legislature now which would provide access to and protections in places of public accommodations for transgender people and those who are gender non-conforming. Areas of public accommodations include public transportation, retail stores, parks, restaurants, medical offices, theaters and hotels.

Freedom Massachusetts, the organizing body for this legislation, hopes that people of faith will be called to stand for these rights as human rights and see supporting them as an expression of one's faith. It hopes that people of faith will pray for and work for fair laws that provide health, safety, respect and peace of mind for transgender and gender non-conforming people.

You may sign on as a supporter of the transgender legislation and write your legislators and the governor at <u>freedommassachusetts.org</u>. It's an easy "click" on this site.

On April 24, we hope you will join us in a program of understanding and education when we welcome a Wellesley neighbor who will share her experiences as a transgender person of faith.

We are all made in God's expansive image. Let us pray that all expressions of God's image may be honored, protected and loved.
