<u>Volunteer Opportunity for Baby Basics:</u> Driver(s) needed to pick up/drop off diapers

**When:** Pick up diapers first Monday of every month and have them delivered into South Boston by 5 pm.

**Where**: Pick up from BJ's in Weymouth and deliver them to the South Boston Community Health Center in South Boston.

How often: Once a month

**What's needed**: A car/truck/van large enough to fit 15+# of cases of diapers. (If you're not sure how many you can fit, give us a call and we can talk about it.) The staff @ BJ's and the SBCHC usually help w/loading/unloading of diapers but volunteers should be able to move them independently if needed.

**Why:** We rely on our diaper drivers to pick up/deliver the diapers so that we can provide these free diapers to our working, low-income families. We are growing our program so need more volunteers.

14 12W (800-1100 lumens) A-21 lamps 45 8W (450-800 lumens) A-19 lamps 30 8W (450-800 lumens) G25 lamps

All of the lamps should have a temperature of 2700K which will provide warmer light. Check out the EMT bulletin board for more information about LED bulbs.
